She has lived her vocation with remarkable dedication. Even in her later years, despite losing the ability to speak, she continues to inspire those around her with her determination, grace, and ever-present smile.

January 2, 1950, in the quaint hamlet of Kisni Bertoli, Gumla, to Mr. Junas Topno and Mrs. Elizabeth Kandulna. She was born under the parish of Kudda, within the Diocese of Khurti, in the state of Jharkhand, India. Fifteen days after her birth, she was baptized on

January 17, 1950, at her parish church, then located a Torpa, and was given the name Flora. Affectionately called "Folo," she was the youngest of three siblings, with an elder brother and an elder sister. Surrounded by the natural beauty of her homeland and nurtured by the unwavering love of her devoted parents, Flora grew up with a deep sense of faith and purpose. Her roots in this serene village fostered in her a profound connection with both God's creation and the people she was destined to serve

Schooling

School, a "house of knowledge" and a "temple of learning," illuminated the life of our dear Sr. Flora. At the break of day, she eagerly made her way to this temple of knowledge to learn. Thus, her educational journey began at Roman Catholic Mission School, Kisni, where she completed Kindergarten to Class III from 1960 to 1963. She then continued her studies at Marcha from Class IV to VIII, from 1964 to 1967. Subsequently, in 1971, she successfully completed her matriculation from St. Anne Girls' High School, Torpa, growing up alongside girls of her age and joyfully walking long distances to school each day. Surrounded by the natural beauty of her homeland and nurtured by the love of her devoted parents, teachers, and friends, she grew up with a deep sense of faith and purpose.

Vocation:

After completing her higher secondary education at St. Anne Girls' School, she felt a profound calling in her heart. At the age of 20, she shared her desire to dedicate her life fully to Christ. This deep yearning led her to make the decision to leave her family and home/behind, feeling that her true purpose was to serve others and follow Christ's example more closely. She embraced the life of a religious nun, seeking to live in simplicity, humility, and devotion, away from the distractions of the world. Her decision was rooted in a desire to embody love, selflessness, and faith, as she took up the path of religious life with the hope of doing God's work and spreading His message of compassion and grace.

Her burning desire to become a nun brought her to Assam along with her two companions to a lovely convent known as St. Mary's Convent, Barpeta Road. She

reached the community on May 23, 1972, and joined the vibrant and enthusiastic girls who were already there, training themselves to become the spouses of Christ.



Sr. Flora had been enjoying the fullness of life until 2023. However, due to health issues, she was moved to Ichapur for the treatment, where she suffered a stroke that left her completely paralyzed. Her chances of survival seemed little, but by the grace of God and through the prayers of all the

sisters and family members, she miraculously recovere. She was brought to the Bandel community in August for her recuperation.

Though she is now able to walk, the stroke left her with the inability to speak. Despite this, Sr. Flora has regained much of her independence. She helps herself with daily tasks and walks around the house twice a day, holding a rosary in her hands praying for everyone. Her presence has become the heart of the community. Whether it's the sisters, aspirants, hostel girls, or domestic staff, everyone enjoys communicating with her. They speak to her in sign language or regular conversation, and she responds with expressive sounds, bringing joy to all who interact with her.

With the community Sisters

Sr. Flora is always on the move, walking through our community—whether in the garden, kitchen, or veranda. Whenever she meets someone, she offers kind and encouraging words. In her routine life, she brings color by holding her rosary and spending her mornings in prayer in the ap chapel. If anyone looks for her, they will find her nowhere else but there. She shares meals and conversations with the sisters in the refectory, joins in community prayers, sometimes attends meetings, and spends time reading newspaper or spiritual books. One of the most inspiring things about Sr. Flora is her deep prayer life. Even without words, she prays with great devotion, encouraging us to grow in our own faith. We are grateful for Sr. Flora's presence and the example she sets for us all.





Sr. Flora embodied punctuality in every aspect of community life, setting a shining example for the young formees. She took a special interest in the candidates, gently waking them up when they doze off during study

hours with a patient and affectionate touch. Whenever they south her blessing and prayer, she would humbly nod in agreement, her presence radiating warmth and kindness. The candidates deeply feel her love and car, cherishing her in return with heartfelt affection.

With the Boarding Children

Sr. Flora showed the love of Jesus by caring for the boarding children with kindness and affection. She helped them with their daily tasks, studies, and playtime. Speaking to them in their own language made them so happy, bringing bright smiles to their faces. Sr. Bincy's life experience with Sr. Flora



I had the privilege of working closely with Sr. Flora during the second year of my religious life in Agiamore as a touring missionary. Together, we visited villages, engaged in pastoral work, and truly embraced the essence of missionary life. It was with her that I experienced firsthand what it means to be an MSMHC missionary staying in villages, walking long distances, and tirelessly spreading the word of God. Sr. Flora was incredibly enthusiastic about pastoral work. When she joined the community, it was her first time venturing into the Santal Parganas. Though she didn't initially know the local language, her zeal and enthusiasm were unstoppable. From the very first day, she eagerly visited the villages, preached, and worked tirelessly to bring souls closer to Jesus. We shared the same room in the community, and I vividly recall her daily routine. She would rise at 4:30 a.m., begin her morning prayers, and immediately focus on the day's plans. She would say, "Coche, today we have the catechists' meeting. How many are coming—30, 40, or maybe 15? We need to pray for them." Her unwavering commitment to pastoral work was evident in everything she did.

In that area, missionary work had been dormant for nearly 10 years, but Sr. Flora revived it. We would visit a village, stay for three or four days, and then move onto the next village to continue our mission. Often, we traveled on foot from one village to another, enduring the scorching sun, praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and the Rosary, and making our way through jungles and narrow pathways while carrying our luggage. Once she would reach a village, she never rested. She visited the people, talked to them, preached, and shared the message of Jesus with everyone she encountered. Whether she saw people sitting outside their homes or met someone on the way, she would seize the opportunity to say something meaningful and share the Good News. Her missionary spirit was truly extraordinary. Through her actions, she taught me what it means to be a missionary. Despite being a senior sister, she adjusted to every situation with grace and humility. When we stayed in villages, we often slept on the floor bathed outside at night under the open sky, and adapted to the simplest of living conditions. In new villages without toilets, she would guide the locals to create makeshift ones using areca nut leaves, turning them into basic washrooms where we could bathe

Another thing I vividly remember about Sr. Flora was her deep devotion to prayer, especially during adoration. She would spend long hours in prayer, particularly before visiting villages or homes. Whenever she visited a house or met someone who was sick, she would pray a deliverance prayer and offer prayers over them with great faith and compassion. Sr. Flora had an incredible ability to connect with people of all ages. She was one with the elderly, sharing their wisdom and experiences, and equally at ease with the young, engaging with their energy and enthusiasm. Her missionary spirit was truly captivating, especially for me as a young religious sister. She inspired me with her faith, her dedication, and her tireless commitment to serving others. Every day, she meticulously planned and prepared for the next program. She even preached in marketplaces, undeterred by language barriers. Mixing Hindi, Mundari, and Bengali, she creatively shared the message of Jesus. Even during journeys, she never missed an opportunity to proclaim His name. Her missionary zeal defined her life. I can confidently

say that if one could "squeeze her," the very essence of her missionary spirit would pour out. Even in her old age, she sang, danced, taught action songs, and preached with the same energy and passion. I was deeply inspired by her life and mission. Her example taught me what it truly means to be a missionary and her legacy continues to guide and inspire me every day.

What struck me most was when Sr. Flora introduced me to our community's pet dogs. She lovingly told them my name, where I was from and that I would be part of their family too. This simple yet heartfelt gesture delighted me, and its memory remains special. These small acts of kindness spoke volumes about Sr. Flora's compassionate nature, and I felt grateful to experience her warmth and hospitality from the very beginning.

Like my fellow missionary sisters, Sr. Flora had a profound devotion to the Holy Eucharist and the Blessed Sacrament.
