DECREE ON THE GRANTING OF INDULGENCE DURING THE ORDINARY JUBILEE YEAR 2025 CALLED BY HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS, 13.05.2024

I.- PILGRIMAGES

The faithful, *pilgrims of hope*, will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence granted by the Holy Father if they undertake a pious pilgrimage:

to any sacred Jubilee site: by devoutly participating in Holy Mass (where the liturgical norms allow for it, the Mass of the Jubilee might fruitfully be chosen, or one of the Votive Masses: for Reconciliation, for the Remission of Sins, for the Promotion of Charity or to Foster Harmony); a ritual Mass for the conferral of the sacraments of Christian Initiation or the Anointing of the Sick; or any of the following: a celebration of the Word of God; the Liturgy of the Hours (office of readings, lauds, vespers); the Via Crucis; the Marian Rosary; the recitation of the Akathist hymn; a penitential celebration, which ends with the individual confessions of the penitents, as established in the Rite of Penance (form II);

in Rome: by visiting at least one of the four Major Papal Basilicas: St. Peter's in the Vatican, the Archbasilica of the Holy Saviour (St John Lateran's), Saint Mary Major's, and St. Paul's Outside the Walls;

in the Holy Land: by visiting at least one of the three basilicas: the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the Basilica of the Nativity in Bethlehem, or the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth;

in other ecclesiastical areas: by visiting the Cathedral or other church or sacred place designated by the local Ordinary. Bishops will take into account the needs of the faithful as well as the opportunity to reinforce the concept of pilgrimage with all its symbolic significance, so as to manifest the great need for conversion and reconciliation;

II.- PIOUS VISITS TO SACRED PLACES

Likewise, the faithful can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if, individually or in a group, they devoutly visit any Jubilee site and there, for a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any legitimate form, and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God, so that in this Holy Year everyone "will come to know the closeness of Mary, the most affectionate of mothers, who never abandons her children" (*Spes non confundit*, 24).

During the Jubilee Year, in addition to the aforementioned places of pilgrimage, the following sacred places may also be visited under the same conditions:

in Rome: the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, the Basilica of St Lawrence at the Verano, the Basilica of St Sebastian, (the traditional visit to "the seven Churches of Rome", so close to the heart of St Philip Neri is also highly recommended), the Sanctuary of Divine Love (the 'Divino Amore'), the Church of the Holy Spirit in Sassia, the Church of St Paul at the Tre Fontane, (the site of the Martyrdom of the Apostle), the Roman Catacombs; the churches of the Jubilee Pathways dedicated respectively to the IterEuropaeum and to the Female Patrons of Europe and Doctors of the Church (the Basilica of Santa Maria sopra Minerva, and the churches of St Brigid at Campo de' Fiori, Santa Maria della Vittoria, Trinità dei Monti, the Basilica of Saint Cecilia in Trastevere, and the Basilica of Sant'Augustine in Campo Marzio);

in other places in the world: the two Minor Papal Basilicas in Assisi – those of St Francis and Our Lady of the Angels; the Pontifical Basilicas of Our Lady of Loreto, Our Lady of Pompeii, and St Anthony in Padua; any minor basilica, cathedral church, co-cathedral church, Marian sanctuary, any distinguished collegiate church or sanctuary designated by the diocesan bishop or Eparchy for the benefit of the faithful, and national or international sanctuaries, "sacred places of welcome and privileged spaces for the rebirth of hope" (Spes non confundit, 24), as indicated by Episcopal Conferences.

The faithful who are truly repentant of sin but who cannot participate in the various solemn celebrations, pilgrimages and pious visits for serious reasons (especially cloistered nuns and monks, but also the elderly, the sick, prisoners, and those who, through their work in hospitals or other care facilities, provide continuous service to the sick), can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence, under the same conditions if, united in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, (especially when the words of the Supreme Pontiff or the diocesan Bishop are transmitted through the various means of communication), they recite the Our Father, the Profession of Faith in any approved form, and other prayers in conformity with the objectives of the

Holy Year, in their homes or wherever they are confined (e.g. in the chapel of the monastery, hospital, nursing home, prison...) offering up their sufferings or the hardships of their lives;

III.-WORKS OF MERCY AND PENANCE

In addition, the faithful will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if, with a devout spirit, they participate in popular missions, spiritual exercises, or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place, according to the mind of the Holy Father.

Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day (cf. *Enchiridion Indulgentiarum*, IV ed., norm. 18, § 1), the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in Purgatory, if they receive Holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, applicable only to the deceased (this must take place within a Eucharistic celebration; see can. 917 and the Pontifical Commission for the authentic interpretation of the CIC, *Responsa ad dubia*, 1, 11 July 1984). Through this double act, a praiseworthy exercise of supernatural charity is carried out, through that bond by which the faithful still journeying on this earth are united in the mystical Body of Christ, with those who have already completed their journey, by virtue of the fact that "the Jubilee indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy" (*Spes non confundit*, 22).

In a special way "during the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind" (*Spes non confundit*, 10). Therefore, the Indulgence is also linked to certain works of mercy and penance, which bear witness to the conversion undertaken. The faithful, following the example and mandate of Christ, are encouraged to carry out works of charity or mercy more frequently, especially in the service of those brothers and sisters who are burdened by various needs. More especially, they should rediscover these "corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead "(*Misericordiae vultus*, 15) and rediscover also "the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead" (ibid.).

In this way, the faithful will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if they visit, for an appropriate amount of time, their brothers and sisters who are in need or in difficulty (the sick, prisoners, lonely elderly people, disabled people...), in a sense making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them (cf. Mt 25, 34-36) according to the usual spiritual, sacramental and prayer conditions. The faithful can repeat these visits throughout the Holy Year, even daily, acquiring a plenary indulgence each time.

The Jubilee Plenary Indulgence can also be obtained through initiatives that put into practice, in a concrete and generous way, the spirit of penance which is, in a sense, the soul of the Jubilee. In particular the penitential nature of Friday can be rediscovered through abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week from futile distractions (real but also virtual distractions, for example, the use of the media and/or social networks), from superfluous consumption (for example by fasting or practising abstinence according to the general norms of the Church and the indications of the Bishops), as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor; by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defence and protection of life in all its phases, but also by supporting the quality of life of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely elderly people, or migrants from various countries "who leave their homelands behind in search of a better life for themselves and for their families" (*Spes non confundit*, 13); it can also be obtained by dedicating a reasonable portion of one's free time to voluntary activities that are of service to the community or to other similar forms of personal commitment.

All diocesan bishops and eparchs and those who are equivalent to them in law, on the most appropriate day of this jubilee period, on the occasion of the main celebration in the cathedral and in the individual jubilee churches, may impart the *Papal Blessing* with the attached plenary indulgence, obtainable by all the faithful who receive this *Blessing* under the usual conditions.

In order to facilitate access to the sacrament of Penance and the obtaining of divine forgiveness through the 'Power of the Keys', local Ordinaries are invited to grant to the Canons and Priests, who in the Cathedrals



and Churches specially designated for the Holy Year, hear the confessions of the faithful, the faculties limited to the internal forum for the faithful of the Eastern Churches covered by can. 728, § 2 of the CCEO, and in the case of a possible reservation, those for can. 727, excluding, clearly, those cases listed in can. 728, § 1; while for the faithful of the Latin Church, the faculties referred to in can. 508, § 1 of the CIC.

In this regard, this Penitentiary urges all priests to offer generous availability and self-dedication to allow the greatest possible opportunity for the faithful to benefit from the means of salvation, by adopting and publishing time slots for confessions, in agreement with parish priests or rectors of neighbouring churches, by making time to be available in the confessional, planning penitential celebrations on a fixed and frequent basis, and also making the widest possible use of retired priests who do not have other defined pastoral roles. Depending on the possibilities, priests should remember, in accordance with the *Motu proprio Misericordia Dei*, the pastoral opportunity that also exists in hearing Confessions during the celebration of Holy Mass.

To facilitate the task of confessors, the Apostolic Penitentiary, by mandate of the Holy Father, grants to priests who accompany or join Jubilee pilgrimages outside their own Diocese the right to make use of the same faculties which they have been granted in their own Diocese by the legitimate authority. Special faculties will be conferred by this Apostolic Penitentiary to the penitentiaries of the Papal Basilicas in Rome, and to Canon Penitentiaries or Diocesan Penitentiaries established in individual ecclesiastical circumscriptions.

Confessors, after having lovingly instructed the faithful on the gravity of the sins to which a reservation or censure is attached, should determine, with pastoral charity, appropriate sacramental penances, so as to lead penitents, as far as possible to stable repentance and, depending on the nature of the case, invite them to repair any scandal and damages.

Finally, the Penitentiary warmly invites Bishops, as bearers of the triple *munus* of teaching, guiding, and sanctifying, to explain clearly the provisions and principles proposed here for the sanctification of the faithful, taking account of local circumstances, cultures and traditions. A catechesis appropriate to the socio-cultural characteristics of each people will propose the Gospel and the entirety of the Christian message effectively, rooting more deeply in people's hearts the desire for this unique gift, obtained through the mediation of the Church.

This Decree is valid for the entire Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary.



LIFE STYLE AND OBLIGATIONS OF RELIGIOUS: A SUMMARY

Introduction

The Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) brought a renewed understanding of religious life, pointing out its essential role in the mission of the Church. The Code of Canon Law (CIC 1983) provides the framework for understanding and regulating religious life within the Church. On this basis, I would like

to present a summary of the article "Life Style and Obligations of Religious" from the book "Religious Life according to Vatican II" by Elio Gambari.

Life Style

Within the Christian tradition, the religious lifestyle is deeply rooted in the biblical teachings and the documents of the Church. The biblical basis for a religious lifestyle is woven throughout the Gospels and the letters of Paul, reinforcing the importance of love, community life, moral integrity etc. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches the significance of the sacraments, prayer, moral living, guiding individuals in their spiritual journeys and fostering a sense of belonging within the Church. Thus, a religious lifestyle is a holistic approach to life in alignment with biblical principles and Church teachings.

A religious lifestyle can be understood canonically through the lens of Church law and doctrine, particularly within the framework of the Code of Canon Law and various Church documents. The life style of religious demands a concrete reality by canon 607 §3, "The public witness to be rendered by religious to Christ and the Church entails a separation from the world proper to the character and purpose of each institute." Consecrated and sent forth to carry out the mission of Christ, religious are intimately concerned for and involved in the world, yet separated from it by their public witness of the chaste, poor and obedient Christ. This life style of witness that sets religious apart from worldly values and achievements which are often antithetical to Christian life and the nature and purpose of their institutes. In this way, a religious lifestyle is not only a personal commitment but also a communal expression of faith that aligns with both canonical principles and biblical teachings.

Residence in a Religious House

The concept of residence in a religious institute is deeply rooted in canon law and the ecclesial mission of religious life. Canon 607 states that religious institutes are societies in which members, through the profession of the evangelical counsels, strive for the perfection of charity and participate in the mission of the Church. Residence in such institutes is not merely a physical arrangement but a spiritual commitment to community life, prayer, and the pursuit of holiness. In this context, the residence of religious members fosters an environment conducive to spiritual growth and communal support. Canon 608 requires that the community dwell in a house



legitimately constituted under the authority of a superior. The residence has been the object of norms, both to assure religious of a suitable dwelling and to order the life of the community. The duty of residence is explicitly affirmed by canon 665 §1: Religious are to live in their own religious house and not to be absent from it without the permission of the legitimate superior.

Moreover, residing in a religious institute provides a structured setting for the practice of the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience. The Rule of Life specific to each institute outlines the daily rhythm of life, prayer, work, and community engagement, guiding members in their spiritual journey. This structure helps individuals to cultivate a deeper relationship with God and their community members, fostering a sense of belonging and shared mission.

Ultimately, residence in a religious institute serves as a manifestation of a life dedicated to God and the Church. It embodies the call to holiness, rooted in Scripture and canon law, while also fulfilling the communal and apostolic dimensions of religious life. The communal aspect mirrors the early Christian community described in Acts 2:44-47, where believers lived together, shared their resources, and devoted themselves to prayer and teaching. By living in accordance with the ideals of their respective institutes, members not only grow in their own spiritual lives but also contribute to the wider mission of the Church, becoming witnesses of God's love and grace in the world.

Religious Habit

The religious habit is considered as a sign of consecration for those who have publicly embraced the profession of the evangelical counsels, and who want to be a reminder and a stimulus for the other faithful. It has also a spiritual and ascetical function and in its own way expresses separation from the world. Canon 669 §1 regulates a timely point of interest: "Religious are to wear the habit of the institute made according to the norm of proper law as a sign of their consecration and as a testimony of poverty."

Pope John Paul II and the organs of the Holy See, at several stages responded and recalled the attention of religious to the religious habit and the will of the Church. Even if the religious habit in itself does not have an absolute value, what really matters are the reasons for which it is worn, the reality which it expresses, and the same purposes intended by the founders and the Church. The existing norms must be observed with docility in a spirit of faith and love.

In *Evangelica Testificatio*, the apostolic exhortation by Pope Paul VI in 1971 (n.22) gives norms and guidelines in these terms: "While we recognize that certain situations can justify the abandonment of a religious type of dress, we cannot pass over in silence the fittingness that the dress of religious women and men should be, as the Council wishes, a sign of their consecration and that it should be in some way different from the forms which are clearly secular." The application of this principle must be made according to the dispositions of the Holy See and the norms of the constitutions approved by the Holy See. The different character of religious institutes and the variety of ministries in which they are involved, as well as the direction taken in the adaptation of apostolic activity, will be reflected in their exterior life style.



Silence

In silence man finds God, rediscovers oneself and prepares to meet God. On October 24, 1964, Pope Paul VI spoke of the need to recover one's personal life, which is threatened by the feverish excitement of modern conditions. "Man is in need of silence with its own interior language, in need of order, in need of prayer and peace, in need of his true self" (AAS 56, 1964). It is necessary, therefore, to create awareness of the religious and social value of silence and observe it in a way that is



more personal and vital. Man observes silence as an exigency of the divine love, in order to listen to God. The mere absence of words and noise does not suffice, since ability to God requires a silence embracing the whole being (cf. *ET* 46). In the tranquillity of silence, individuals may find clarity regarding their life's direction or insight into complex issues. This can lead to breakthroughs in understanding and wisdom.

In essence, religious silence is not merely the absence of sound; it is a profound practice that enriches spiritual life, encourages personal development, and fosters deeper connections with oneself, others, and the divine.

Work

Commitment and diligence in the good use of time and in the development of one's own abilities for a greater effectiveness in any field of activity can be summed up in St. Benedict's motto: *Ora et labora* (pray and work). Every human activity, manual, intellectual or artistic considered work (*PC* 13). The gifts of intelligence and will, of nature and grace, the physical energies themselves are talents and gifts destined in the divine plan to produce fruits for the glory of God and service of men. Hence the whole work of the religious, even material work, is changed into apostolate. The activity of each member of an apostolic institute participates in the apostolate of all and becomes a witness of unity and charity. In the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II addressed the importance of work and human dignity. Work is seen as a human vocation and is not merely a means to survive or earn a living, but a way to contribute to the common good and participate in God's creative activity.

Conclusion

Religious life presented both according to Vatican II and Canon Law stands as a unique and vital expression of following Christ (*sequela Christi*). Rooted in the public profession of the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience, religious life is a communal path to holiness and a radical witness to the kingdom of God. The religious manifests the prophetic and eschatological function of the Church in their spiritual and sacred dimension. For this reason, religious are at the service of the church, the People of God, whose mission is building up of God's kingdom.

The Santhal villages we visited are surrounded by agricultural fields, pastures, ponds, and graveyards. Each house has a long verandah. Rooms

are very spacious. Towards the corner of the main room, there is a sacred place or the prayer room where they keep the statue of Jesus/Mary or other images along with lighted candles. We read the word of God and prayed in each house. The people were very much welcoming and loving. We did enjoy our stay and experienced their love and care.

We've realized that God gave us all the experiences we needed before and during those days so that we could successfully complete the mission. For that, no amount of compensation will balance the debt we are in to God.

We are also indebted to Sr. Sini Mathew (The Provincial Superior) who permitted us to do this great task of saving souls. We

are forever grateful to Sr. Meena Tirkey (Provincial Councillor for Evangelization) and the community members for meticulous planning and arranging places for us. We are grateful to

organized in rural areas so that villagers can get treatment and consultation for various diseases. He encouraged us to continue to conduct such camps and provide benefits of government to such villagers.

DISCOVERING COMMUNITARIAN VIRTUES AND VALUES IN COMMUNITY

Community is a gift. God is the architect of religious community. For, it is the love of God that has called us together to live as a community. And the love of God has been poured into our hearts through His Spirit empowering all with gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Virtues are like bricks which lays foundation and builds our inner life. Values are an overflow of a strong virtuous life. There are various types of virtues and values. The Church teaches us about four Cardinal virtues and three Theological

virtues. The Cardinal virtues are: Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance. The Theological virtues are: Faith, Hope and Charity. Life in community can be worth living when one possess the communitarian virtues and values.

The word Community has derived from the Latin word "communitas" which means "community" or "public spirit". Here I would like to break the word "COMMUNITY" into single letters and try to unfold the virtues and values of community living with my personal experience in the community.

C – It is the first letter of the word community which stands for CHARITY. Our founder said, "Your convents must be houses of "charity" where all sisters live united one body and soul under the mantle of Our Lady." Consecrated souls are called to be charitable through their caring, compassionate and courageous spirit.

O – It signifies the virtue of OBEDIENCE. Sanctity came to the world through the obedience of Our Lord Jesus Christ, who was obedient unto death. In obedience Mary said, "Let it be to me according to thy word." Our founder said, "The road which leads straight to heaven is "Obedience – Road" (Letter of Bp. Ferrando 14th August, 1942). Hence, we are called to obey in community like Jesus and Mary.

M – It highlights the virtue of MISSIONARY ZEAL. Jesus called his disciples to be with him and to send out. "I thirst" reveals Jesus' zeal for souls. "I am not a missionary who goes but who is," manifest missionary zeal of

our founder. In the community we have the opportunity to cultivate missionary spirit or zeal for souls through the mission entrusted to our care.

M – The second M has a greater influence as it denotes the virtue of MEEKNESS. It is the flower of charity said our founder venerable Stephen Ferrando. Our founder reminds us in his letter dated 20th June, 1944, "Jesus is repeating to us the





words written in the Gospel, "Learn of Me, because I am meek and humble of heart – Learn of Me not to work miracles, to create the world but humility and meekness."

U – It indicate the most important virtue of a community, that is UNITY. "I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one" (Jn. 17:23). "The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul" (Acts.4:32). The unity of heart, mind, soul and spirit in the community can strengthen ones love for vocation and mission.

N – It suggest the virtue of NOVELTY. It means the quality of being new or original. It can be said in another sense as being authentic or genuine. Jesus was convinced that, he is the beloved son of God and he lived and proved it until death. God has created us with our own originality, with his mark of divinity. He did not create us as a carbon copy of anyone. Thus, He expects us to be authentic, genuine and convince of our originality by living a life of novelty in our community.

I – It is rightly connotation of the virtue of INNOCENCE. Gospel of Saint Mathew, chapter 10: 16 says "Be wise as serpents and innocent as doves." Again we see in the same gospel chapter 18:3 "Unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Thus, it's a clarion call to all to be pure, holy and live a reconciled life through the sacraments in the community. We must strive daily to change and transform ourselves in the community.

T – It emphasizes the virtue of TRUST. Venerable Bishop Stephen Ferrando rightly said, "PUT ALL YOUR TRUST IN God. CENTRE IN HIM ALL YOUR FEAR AND ALL YOU LOVE. HE WILL MAKE HIMSELF RESPONSIBLE FOR YOU. AND ALL WILL GO WELL, AS HE SEES BEST." Thus, trust in God can enable one to trust sisters in the community.

Y—It marks the virtue of YOUTHFULNESS. It means joyful spirit and vibrancy that emanates the entire life of a religious community. Consecrated life is a life of joy. This joy is a joy of the Holy Spirit. Jesus himself said, "rejoice in the Holy Spirit" (LK.10:21). It is in total renunciation of sin and world we have complete joy. It is in finding Jesus we have joy. "One filled with the joy preaches without preaching" said Saint Mother Teresa. Therefore, in community, life in the spirit must abound and permeates totally where every sister remain youthful in spirit until we reach our final destiny.







SCIENCE EXHIBITION



We congratulate YAC on this significant milestone and wish them a joyous and blessed Jubilee year!





'ANTIQUA ET NOVA': NEW VATICAN DOCUMENT-POTENTIAL AND RISKS OF AI



he Vatican has released a new document on the use, risks and potential that the artificial Intelligence (AI) carries.

The new document is probably the outcome of Pope's warning on the AI. The new document is addressed especially to "those entrusted with transmitting the faith," but also to "those who share the conviction that

scientific and technological advances should be directed toward serving the human person and the common good"

In 117 paragraphs, "Antiqua et Nova" highlights challenges and opportunities of the development of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the fields of education, economy, work, health, relationships, and warfare. In the latter sphere, for instance, the document warns of the AI's potential to increase "the instruments of war well beyond the scope of human oversight and precipitating a destabilizing arms race, with catastrophic consequences for human rights".

DANGERS AND PROGRESS

Specifically, the document lists not only the risks but also the progress associated with AI, which it encourages as "part of the collaboration of man and woman with God". However, it does not avoid the concerns that come with all innovations, whose effects are still unpredictable.

DISTINGUISHING BETWEEN ALAND HUMAN INTELLIGENCE

Several paragraphs of the Note are devoted to the distinction between AI and human intelligence. Quoting Pope Francis, the document affirms that "the very use of the word 'intelligence' in connection to AI 'can prove misleading'... in light of this, AI should not be seen as *an artificial form* of human intelligence, but as *a product* of it". "Like any product of human ingenuity, AI can also be directed toward positive or negative ends". "AI" could introduce important innovations but it also risks aggravating situations of discrimination, poverty, "digital divide," and social inequalities. "The concentration of the power over mainstream AI applications in the hands of a few powerful companies raises significant ethical concerns," including "the risk that AI could be manipulated for personal or corporate gain or to direct public opinion for the benefit of a specific industry".

WAR

With reference to war, "Antiqua et Nova" stresses that autonomous and lethal weapons systems capable of "identifying and striking targets without direct human intervention are a "cause for grave ethical concern". It notes that Pope Francis has called for their use to be banned since they pose "an 'existential risk' by having the potential to act in ways that could threaten the survival of entire regions or even of humanity itself". "This danger demands serious attention," the document says, "reflecting the long-standing concern about technologies that grant war 'an uncontrollable destructive power over great numbers of innocent civilians,' without even sparing children".



HUMAN RELATIONS

On human relations, the document notes that AI can lead to "harmful isolation", that "anthropomorphizing AI" poses problems for children's growth and that misrepresenting AI as a person is "a grave ethical violation" if this is done "for fraudulent purposes." Similarly, "using AI to deceive in other contexts—such as education or in human relationships, including the sphere of sexuality—is also to be considered immoral and requires careful oversight".

ECONOMY AND LABOUR

The same vigilance is called for in the economic-financial sphere. "Antiqua et Nova" notes that, especially in the field of labour, "while AI promises to boost productivity... current approaches to the technology can paradoxically deskill workers, subject them to automated surveillance, and relegate them to rigid and repetitive tasks".

HEALTH

The Note also dedicates ample space to the issue of healthcare. Recalling the "immense potential" in various applications in the medical field, it warns that if AI were to replace the doctor-patient relationship, it would risk "worsening the loneliness that often accompanies illness". It also warns that "the integration of AI into healthcare also poses the risk of amplifying other existing disparities in access to medical care," with the risk of "reinforcing a 'medicine for the rich' model, where those with financial means benefit from advanced preventative tools and personalized health information while others struggle to access even basic services".

EDUCATION

In the field of education, "Antiqua et Nova" notes that "AI presents both opportunities and challenges." If used prudently, AI can improve access to education and offer "immediate feedback" to students. One problem is that many programmes "merely provide answers instead of prompting students to arrive at answers themselves or write text for themselves"; which can lead to a failure to develop critical thinking skills. The note also warns of the "biased or fabricated information" and "fake news" some programmes can generate.

FAKE NEWS AND DEEPFAKES

On the subject of fake news, the document warns of the serious risk of AI "generating manipulated content and false information", which becomes worse when it is spread with the aim of deceiving or causing harm. "Antiqua et Nova" insists that "Those who produce and share AI-generated content should always exercise diligence in verifying the truth of what they disseminate and, in all cases, should 'avoid the sharing of words and images that are degrading of human beings, that promote hatred and intolerance, that debase the goodness and intimacy of human sexuality or that exploit the weak and vulnerable'.

PRIVACYAND CONTROL

On privacy and control, the Note points out that some types of data can go so far as to touch "upon the individual's interiority, perhaps even their conscience", with the danger of everything becoming "a kind of spectacle to be examined and inspected". Digital surveillance "can also be misused to exert control over the lives of believers and how they express their faith".

COMMON HOME

On the topic of the care of creation, "Antiqua et Nova" says, "AI has many promising applications for improving our relationship with our 'common home". "At the same time, current AI models and the hardware required to support them consume vast amounts of energy and water, significantly contributing to CO2 emissions and straining resources".

THE RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

Finally, the Note warns against the risk of humanity becoming "enslaved to its own work". Artificial intelligence, "Antiqua et Nova" insists, "should be used only as a tool to complement human intelligence rather than replace its richness"
