Auxilium Convent, Siliguri



ANNUAL ASSESSMENT AT NIRMAL SADAN - KHATEGAON

On 20.02.2024 as usual every year from IDSSS(Indore Diocese Social Service) Rev. Bishop Chacko, Rev. Fr. Martin Kujur Director of IDSSS and Mrs. Nita Mam arrived at Nirmal Sadan Khategaon at 11.am for the annual assessment of social work.

Sr. Taramani Kujur officially welcomed Rev. Bishop Swamiji, Rev. Fr. Martin Kujur the Director of IDSSS and Nita Mam and then one by one the beneficiaries were called to share their experiences on how the social work is being carried out by the sisters and animator in the center of Khategaon and what are the benefits they get by the IDSSS.

All of them were happy about the work which Sister Taramani Kujur and the animator carries out in Khategaon. From each village 6 members and 15 tailoring members were present. On that day by the help and support of IDSSS 15 women got sewing machine who accomplished their training. They were motivated to strengthened their alternate livelihood by being self-employed in their respective places to support their families.

After the evaluation there was separately short meeting along with Rev. Bishop Swamiji, Rev. Fr. Martin Kujur, Rev. Fr. Mukesh Machar, Sr. Taramani Kujur, Mrs. Nita Mam and Mr. Rajesh Bakore. The social work carried out in Khategaon was much appreciated.

From Nirmal Sadan Khategaon, around 25 kilometers away there are three rural villages Malsagoda, Biloda and Nimora. In these villages by the help and support of IDSSS the sisters are carrying out social work. In these villages they have opened NFE centers and formed the SHG (Self-help group). The people over there are very poor, ignorant, undeveloped, and illiteracy is widespread.

In MP month of December and January is very cold and unbearable. One day fortunately Sr. Taramani Kujur happened to visit those three NFE centers. And she saw more than half of the children had come for classes without warm clothes; they were really trembling. On seeing their condition Sr. Taramani Kujur approached the Bank Manager of Union Bank of India, Indore, Mr. Ajit Kumar Ldwani, and shared with him about the work which the sisters are doing and the situation the rural villages are facing. By hearing he was generous and kind enough, within two days on 6th November 2023, along with three of his staff members he came to distribute sweaters for NFE children and shawl for the SHG members. Sr. Tara thanked them for their quick response and understanding towards the poor people.

POPE PROCLAIMS JUBILEE:

'May Hope Fill Our Days!'

At a ceremony in St Peter's Basilica on Ascension Thursday, Pope Francis solemnly proclaims the upcoming Jubilee Year 2025, consigning the Bull of Indiction – "Spes non confundit. Hope does not disappoint" – to the Archpriests of the Papal Basilicas and representatives of the world's bishops.

"Hope" is the overarching theme of the upcoming Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, a theme reflected in the opening words of the *Bull of Indiction*, entitled "Spes non confundit. Hope does not disappoint."

Long passages of the Bull were read out ahead of Vespers on Ascension Thursday, during a ceremony in which the document was solemnly consigned to the Archpriests of the four Papal Basilicas, the Pro-Prefects of the Dicastery for Evangelization, and representatives of the world's Bishops.


Pope: May the Jubilee be a time to rediscover, Proclaim, build hope

In *Spes non confundit*, Pope Francis announces that the Jubilee Year will begin with the opening of the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve, 2024.

Later, on 29 December, the Pope will open the Holy Door of the Archbasilica of St John Lateran, the Cathedral of Rome. On the same day, every Cathedral and co-Cathedral throughout the world will have Mass celebrated by the local Bishop to mark the opening of the Jubilee.


On the Solemnity of Mary, the mother of God, 1 January 2025, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door for the Basilica of St Mary Major, with the Holy Door for the Basilica of St Paul's Outside the Walls being opened on Sunday, 5 January, the Vigil of Epiphany.

"In the course of the year," Pope Francis writes, "every effort should be made to enable the People of God to



The Jubilee will end in the particular Churches throughout the world on 28 December 2025, with the Holy Doors of St John Lateran, St Mary Major, and St Paul's Outside the Walls being closed on that same date.

And finally, the Jubilee Year will draw to a close in Rome on the Solemnity of Epiphany, 6 January 2026.

An opportunity to be renewed in hope

"Everyone knows what it is to hope," the Pope wrote in the introduction to the Bull. "In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future will bring."

Expressing his desire that the Jubilee might be "an opportunity for us to be renewed in hope, Pope Francis recalled that pilgrimage is "a fundamental event of every Jubilee event," traditionally associated with the human quest for the meaning of life. The artistic masterpieces and the beauty of creation we see on our journey inspire us to praise and thank God for His wondrous works.

In particular, he invited all the particular churches throughout the world to prepare priests and the faithful for

Sacramental Confession, which should be readily available throughout the year.

In a special way, Pope Francis invited the faithful of the Eastern Churches, especially those already in union with the Successor of Peter, to take part in the Jubilee, and to feel welcome in the city of Rome, noting how many are already "enduring their own way of the Cross," forced to leave their lands by violence and instability.

The light of Christian Hope

The Holy Father prayed, too, that during the Holy Year, "the light of Christian hope might illumine every man and woman, as a message of God's love addressed to all," and that "the Church might bear faithful witness to this message in every part of the world."

Reading the "signs of the times," Pope Francis noted the desire for peace in a world increasingly marked by violence and conflict, and the loss of a desire to have children, with many countries facing a "demographic winter." He called for a social covenant to support and foster hope.

The Pope appealed especially for prisoners, recalling the tradition of offering amnesty or pardons during Jubilees, and said he hopes to personally open a Holy Door in a prison, "as a sign inviting prisoners to look to the future with hope and a renewed sense of confidence." And he called for prisoners to be treated in accord with their rights and dignity, while once again pleading for the abolition of the death penalty.

The Bull continues with Pope Francis urging that hope be offered to the sick, to the young and to the elderly – especially grandparents, to migrants and to the poor.

The Holy Father recalled that the fruits of the earth are intended for all, and encouraged everyone to come to the assistance of the poor. In particular, he called on richer nations to forgive the debts of countries that will never be able to repay them.

Recalling that 2025 is the 1700th anniversary of the First Ecumenical Council, Pope Francis urged expressions of synodality, and renewed efforts to further Christian unity. He appealed especially for progress to be made toward a common celebration of Easter, noting that in 2025, providentially, all Christians will celebrate the Paschal mystery on the same date.

A Holy Year Marked By Hope



Consigning the Bull of Indiction

Pope Francis insisted that Christian hope, rooted in Christ's death and resurrection for each human person, points to our final destiny, eternal happiness with God in heaven. We are saved by God's mercy, seen especially in the gift of indulgences: While Confession washes away our sins, indulgences – including the Jubilee Indulgence – remove the effects of sins forgiven in the Sacrament. In the Bull of Indiction, the Pope notes that the specific conditions for receiving the indulgence will be published soon.

The Holy Father concludes the Bull with a final note of hope, praying that "the coming Jubilee will be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God"; and that it might help us recover "the confident trust we require in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation."

"Let us even now be drawn to this hope!"

Spes non confundit ends with Pope Francis exclaiming, "Let us even now be drawn to this hope!" He calls on Christians to live a life in keeping with their faith, as a witness and an invitation to all to "hope in the Lord."

"May the power of hope fill our days," the Pope says, "as we await with confidence the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and glory, now and forever.

It is in Him that we must place our ultimate hope through humble repentance and faith. And, this person is unlike any other: He's the preeminent one. He's the exalted one. He's the all-sufficient One. He is the glorious Christ!

In Jesus, we have a blessed hope; He will return, St. Paul describes Christians as "looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13). How amazing is it that

Sometimes it is easy to be so focused on day-to-day living that we forget that our Savior is coming to gather us to Himself on the appointed day and then we will never be separated from Him or His holiness. 

Whether it is to grow us in faith or draw us closer to Him, God has us where we are for a reason, and He is sustaining us through each difficulty (Isa. 41:10; Rom. 5:1-5).

When we are covered and surrounded by pressure-filled circumstances, our persuasion is to put our hope in changing the circumstances. We tell ourselves, "If only these things which I wanted were to happen, then my life would be better." Instead of focusing on our situation, we need to turn our eyes to the resurrected Christ. We find resurrected life only in our resurrected Lord. Instead of trying harder and "pushing through," we must put our hope in Christ. That is what brings us living hope. There's no situation so difficult, impossible, agonizing, and exhaust of vitality that the risen Lord cannot share His resurrected life with us and see us through it, and if He so wills, even deliver us out of that situation. May we, today, find help, hope, and comfort in Jesus Christ, our living hope.

Hope in Christ is not a blurred expectation or uncertain searching. It is a solid trust in Him and His Word. Visualizing the future with hope in Christ encompasses a profound belief in the promise of redemption, renewal, and ultimate triumph over adversity. Hope in Christ encourages us to approach the future with faith, suppleness, and compassion, striving to personify the principles of love, forgiveness, and service. 

Yet the less traversed trails await, Inviting challenges and grit, A test to strength and boundless will, In which true contentment is knit.





Sr. Emrencia Minj finally thanked everyone for this memorable day to honor our Blessed Mother.











and Fr. John Berger the parish priest, Fr. C.M Paul and Fr. Albert Kujur con-celebrated.


The liturgy was well organized; the Church was crowded with the faithful. There was a short felicitation programme for the children after the Holy Mass.








MARIAN MONTH- PATHWAY TO VIRTUOUS LIFE


A Mother's Love

TECH-SAVVY TEEN TO BE SAINT SOON

ech-savvy Italian teenager Carlo Acutis became the first millennial saint of the Catholic Church. The UK-born prodigy earned the moniker "God's Influencer" after spending his short life spreading faith online.

NB: Millennial refers to a person born between 1981 and 1996.

At the age of 15, Carlo Acutis died of leukaemia in 2006. He was beatified four years ago after it was the Vatican found that a boy recovered miraculously from a disease days after touching Acutis' t-shirt.

Who is Carlo Acutis?

The millennial, who died in 2006, became popular among the masses for using technology to propagate religion. Carlo Acutis was born in London on May 3, 1991. Later, he grew up in Milan. While growing up, Acutis handled his parish website and later began managing a Vatican-based academy.

Miracles attributed to Carlo Acutis

He was beatified four years ago after the Vatican observed that he had miraculously saved another boy's life. The 15-year-old computer prodigy embarked on the path of sainthood after it the Vatican observed that a 7-year-old boy from Brazil reportedly recovered from a rare pancreatic disease after touching one of Acuti's t-shirts.

However, a person qualified as a saint only after at least two miracles have been attributed to them and approved by the Pope. On Thursday, Pope Francis greenlit a second miracle attributed to Acutis. With this, Acutis became the youngest saint till date.

On July 8, 2022, Liliana prayed at Blessed Carlo's tomb in Assisi, leaving a letter describing her plea. Six days earlier, on July 2, her daughter Valeria had fallen from her bicycle in Florence, where she was attending

university.



She had suffered severe head trauma, and required craniotomy surgery and the removal of the right occipital bone to reduce pressure on her brain,

with what her doctors said was a very low chance of survival.

Liliana's secretary began praying immediately to Blessed Carlo Acutis, and on July 8, Liliana made her pilgrimage to his tomb in Assisi.



That same day, the hospital informed her that Valeria had begun to breath spontaneously. The next day, she began to move and partially regain her speech.

On July 18, a CAT scan proved that her haemorrhage had disappeared, and on August 11, Valeria was moved to rehabilitation therapy. She made quick progress, and on September 2, Valeria and Liliana made another pilgrimage to Assisi to thank Blessed Carlo for his intercession.

"I was not an example of sanctity, but for me Carlo was like a teacher, he was special, never a complaint, never a criticism," said carlo's mother.

Carlo's remains on display at Church of Santa Maria Maggiore

Carlo's remains are displayed in a tomb with a glass side at the Church of Santa Maria Maggiore in Assisi.

He appeared astonishingly lifelike, his face reconstructed and body dressed as he lived -- in jeans, trainers and a sweatshirt.

For many Catholics, the place has become a place of pilgrimage. It was also declared the site of the second miracle attributed by the Vatican.

Pope Francis beatified the millennial in 2020 in Assisi, where Blessed Carlo had made multiple pilgrimages and where his mortal remains rest.

Pope Francis on 23rd May 2024 has recognized the miracle attributed to the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis, paving the way for him to become the first millennial saint.



The pontiff brought his moral authority to bear on the G7, invited by host Italy to address a special session on the perils and promises of AI.

Pope Francis has addressed leaders at the G7 Summit in southern Italy, the first pontiff to do so.

Speaking at a special roundtable, the Pope challenged them to keep human dignity foremost in developing and using artificial intelligence, warning that such powerful technology risks turning human relations themselves into algorithms.

"Faced with the marvels of machines, which seem to know how to choose independently, we should be very clear that decision-making, even when we are confronted with its sometimes dramatic and urgent aspects, must always be left to the human person," he said.

"We would condemn humanity to a future without hope if we took away people's ability to make decisions about themselves and their lives, by dooming them to depend on the choices of machines."

The pontiff has offered an ethical take on an issue that is increasingly on the agenda of international summits, government policy and corporate boards.

Francis said politicians must take the lead in making sure AI remains human-centric, so that decisions about when to use weapons or even less-

lethal tools always remain made by humans and not machines.

He also took a swipe at autonomous weapons, saying it should never be left to machines to decide whether or not to kill a person.

No machine should ever choose to take the

life of a human being.

"Allow me to insist, in light of the tragedy that is armed conflict, it is urgent to reconsider the development and use of devices like the so-called 'lethal autonomous weapons' and ultimately ban their use. This starts from an effective and concrete commitment to introduce ever greater and proper human control. No machine should ever choose to take the life of a human being," he said.

The G7 final statement largely reflected his concerns. Leaders vowed to better coordinate the governance and regulatory frameworks surrounding AI to keep it 'human-centred.'

At the same time, they acknowledged the potential impacts on the labour markets of machines taking the place of human workers and on the justice system of algorithms predicting recidivism.

"We will pursue an inclusive, human-centred, digital transformation that underpins economic growth and sustainable development, maximizes benefits, and manages risks, in line with our shared democratic values and respect for human rights," they said.

By attending the summit, Francis joined a chorus of countries and global bodies pushing for stronger guardrails on AI following the boom in generative AI kickstarted by OpenAI's ChatGPT chatbot.

On the weapons issue, G7 leaders said they recognised the impact of AI in the military domain "and the need for a framework for responsible development and use." They encouraged states to make sure "military use of AI is responsible, complies with applicable international law, particularly international humanitarian law, and enhances international security."

WHAT IS G7 MEET?

The G7 is an informal bloc of industrialized democracies — the United States, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and the United Kingdom (UK) — that meets annually to discuss issues such as global economic governance, International security, and most recently, Artificial Intelligence (AI)

THE POPE'S EXORCIST

SYNOPSIS: What should be a normal exorcism in 1980s Spain turns into a battle over the fate of the Catholic Church, as an ancient evil attempts to undermine the power of the church's greatest exorcist.

Father Gabriel Amorth was a fascinating man in his lifetime. He was the Vatican's lead exorcist for decades and became famous for in his battles against the forces of darkness— Which Earlier this year, a modestly successful new movie was released that explored his life, with Russell Crowe in the role of Fr. Amorth.

is one of the least original in contemporary film making. With rare exceptions, its structure, themes, and visual ideas have all been callbacks to *The Exorcist*, with every entry in the genre positively or negatively compared to its predecessor. Maybe it shouldn't be surprising that *The Pope's Exorcist* was not received kindly for that reason.

And it's not hard to see why. Like most exorcism films, it exploits Christian and Catholic imagery in a way that

neither meaningfully depicts it but just uses it as set dressing for supernatural mythology. Characters discuss God, confession, and temptation, and yet it doesn't feel like more than acting in a movie. It feels exploitative as though the filmmakers believe they are spinning a shallow fairy tale that preys upon the prejudices of the common believer.

The Pope's Exorcist follows an American family living in 1980s Spain who move into a large rural Catholic Abbey. When their youngest child begins showing signs of possession, the church calls upon its chief exorcist to protect the child but stumbles upon an ancient secret hidden beneath an ancient Abbey since the fall of Satan—a conspiracy from the depths of Hell to infiltrate and destroy the church itself.

What also makes the film interesting is how immediately it tries to plant itself into the modern social-political issues with the modern Catholic Church, its place in the world, and its own internal battle with its sins, hypocrisies, and failures.

The film directly addresses serious issues like the liberalization of the church in the 1970s, the sex abuse crisis, and the Spanish Inquisition, with Crowe directly calling it "one of the darkest moments in the history of the church." At one point, the Pope's Cardinals threatened to remove Fr. Amorth's position because they are afraid that continuing exorcisms will damage the church's reputation in the 20th century.

Crowe's Amorth is given a passably fascinating story arc, with his own failures and doubts seeping in and affecting the exorcism. While he sarcastically quips that "my only fear is that France will win the World Cup," he has many buried regrets and the demonic entities are able to take advantage of them. Much of the film explores thematic handwringing about the circumstances under which an authentic exorcism can be held. According to the rules of the film, a priest can only perform the exorcism if he is fully confessed, blameless, and unafraid—not letting the fears and regrets of his heart consume him.

The result is a film where Amorth's story mirrors that of the state of the Catholic Church in the 20th century—being a church grappling with uncertainty, failure, decadence, pride, and moral compromise that continues to struggle with affirming its place as the self-proclaimed See of Peter. It is a film that wants to question how the church can operate in spite of its mistakes, with Amorth playing the role of the church's on-call cowboy who can effortlessly and confidently banish demons with a joke.

The Pope's Exorcist is not the most effective film. It is also not an accurate depiction of the life of Fr. Amorth, just as the Conjuring movies are only loosely based on the "true" stories of the Warren's. I doubt much of the film's plot comes from any of Fr. Amorth's real writings, despite the film's claim to be based on his memoirs. But there is a novelty in it as a movie—a schlocky horror film with the optimistic message that evil ultimately has no power in the absence of our guilt and doubt.


